Development of Site-Specific Risk Management and Response Plans

- Local Risks
- Local Resources
 - Hospitals
 - Clinics
 - Police
 - Emergency Services
- Communications Planning



Pre-Departure and On-Site Orientations

- Pre-Departure and On-Site Orientations
- Not just travel logistics, safety/risk management, expectations, and cultural preparation
- Provide key information in print (including emergency cards with key phone #s)
- Consider chunking information and other strategies for engagement and info retention



Emergency Response Planning

- Develop site-specific risk assessments and response plans for each program
- Have clear handbook or protocols for anticipated risk response strategies
- Establish clear phone tree and/or other channels of communication with responders
- Define roles for establishing a response team



Student Code of Conduct Enforcement

- Identifying and enforcing college rules and rules of program
- Threat of harm to self or others
- Violation of law
- Alcohol or drugs
- Sexual harrassment



Contracts

- Clear expectations and responsibilities
 - Term
 - Finances, Cancellation/Refund Dates
 - Specific list of services
- Risk/safety Assessment
- 24-hour contact for ground support
- On-site Orientation
- Subcontractor Selection (eg. boats, drivers)
 - Licensure of providers



Emergency Services Legal language (legal jurisdiction, Severability etc.) Real world smart

Insurance

- Student/participant study abroad insurance
 - Clinic/Hospital
 - Disaster Evacuation
 - Political/Social Evacuation
 - Repatriation
- Liability Insurance
 - \$1-\$2M USD minimum



Communication with Home Campus

- Clear channels of communication
- Full disclosure of any incidents
- Reporting required for any injury, legal issue, or code of conduct violation
- "Timely and appropriate" notification



Beyond Health and Safety: General Issues/Concerns for Study Abroad Partnerships

- Differences in time expectations
 - Deadlines
 - Daily schedules
- Legal/contract-driven US culture
- Finances
 - Sources of program funding
 - Deadlines for program cancellation/refunds
 - Method of payment/money transfer



Cultural Differences

- Economic disparities
- Gender roles, expectations
- Race and identity issues
- LGBT issues



Responding to Common or Anticipated Situations

- Alcohol (Code of Conduct Violation)
- Injury/Medical Health Issue
- More serious hospitalization
- Mental Health
- Group Dynamics
- Sexual Harassment/ Sexual Assault



Emergency Response Steps

 Ensure/verify student safety, locate students
See Handbook Protocols
Document/Log Steps taken
Contact Home Campus Leadership/Designee
Follow-up steps and actions for impacted students and whole group
