WHAT IS GTC?

GTC was founded in 1966 and incorporated as a non-profit organization in 1971. purpose is to promote the highest standards in theatre practice throughout the state of Georgia.

GTC is the official state theatre organization - is made up of five divisions *children's theatre *college/university *community theatre *professional theatre *secondary school theatre - is the state affiliated organization of (SETC) the Southeastern Theatre Conference serves as Region IV of the American Theatre Association.

Membership - is open to individuals, organizations, non-professionals and professionals involved or interested in theatre and its related activities.

Activities - an annual convention is held with seminars, workshops, play festivals, distinguished guests, demonstrations. exhibits, auditions, and business meetings. Play festivals - are held for communtiy, secondary schools, and colleges and universities which are critiqued by a panel of select judges who offer both oral and written comments. Winning plays eligible to participate in SETC and ATA theatre festivals.

Auditions - students and others must participate in the preliminary state summer auditions at the GTC convention in order to be eligible for SETC auditions.



GTC COLLEGE/UNIVERSITY ONE-ACT FESTIVAL

The 1987 festival will be held on Saturday, April 4 at LaGrange College's Price Theatre. Entry/Reservation forms must be received by March 20, 1987. Because the festival can only accommodate a limited number of entrants, scheduling will be done in the order that reservations are received.

Entries may be one-acts or self-contained segments from full-length scripts, and may be directed by students or faculty. Only general illumination will be permitted and a maximum of one hour will be allowed for set-up, performance and strike. Certificates will be given for "Outstanding Performances", and "Outstanding Student Direction" as determined by the adjudicators.

Entrants must be GTC organizational members (\$15.00 annual dues). An entry fee of \$15.00 for each play must accompany the entry form. This fee is used to defray the costs for providing honoraria to adjudicators who will critique the productions. A maximum of two plays may be entered by each school.

The Town and Gown Players of Athens. Georgia were the host theatre and as such did a great job! The community theatre competitions were held at the Players theatre. The day was quite exciting! There were 6 entries judged by Bolton Lunceford, Paul Oppy and Cathi Hamilton. And after lengthy deliberation, On Stage Atlanta was chosen as having produced the best play to represent Georgia for 1986. The one-act they performed was "Graceland". Other awards given were: Best Director from Centerstage North for "Groves of Academe", Terry Kozlowski; Best Actress from On Stage for "Graceland", Kathryn Roth; and Best Actor from Augusta Players for "I'm Herbert", Bob Mums.

FROM THE LONDON STAGE

Mark your calendars for the last week in February when Georgia Southern will present a touring ensemble of 5 professional actors from the Royal Shakespeare Company, the National Theatre of Great Britian, and the BBC Shakespeare series. They will present two performances of The Tempest on the 26th and the 28th and an evening of scenes by Harold Pinter on Friday, the 27th. An added feature of this residency will be a workshop for high school English and Drama instructors on teaching Shakespeare in the public schools. The workshops will take place on Friday, the 27th and Saturday the 28th at 9:00am. Participants will be limited to 75, therefore, we will only accept 3 participants from each school. The cost of the workshop is \$35.00 per participant.
