AUDITIONS. Non equity actors: The state level auditions, which are required for eligibility for the SETC auditions, are sponsored by GTC and held at its annual convention.

WORKSHOPS. Held by the various divisions as locations around the state, workshops put you in touch with people with your own interests and theatrical challenges for down-to-earth, intensive sessions that can really help.
