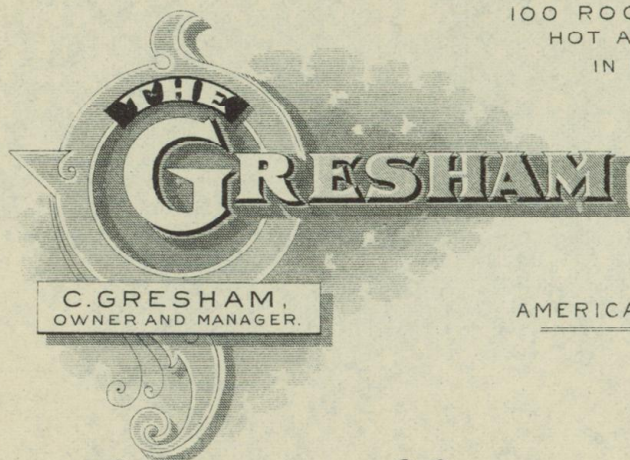
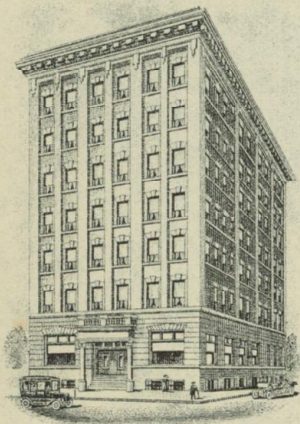
Dearest Mamma, & home folks -

At present Will is down stairs



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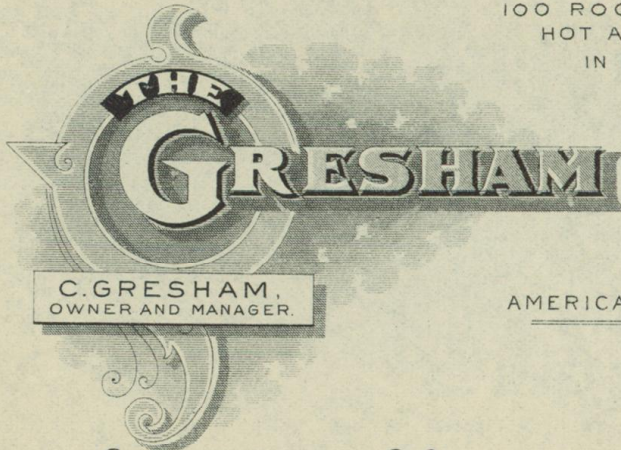
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having a shower, then we have supper
