Vancouver ready to sail, on  
account of the serious  
condition of things in China.  
Tucker started to school  
yesterday - Charles had  
to be at Emory in two weeks.  
Ma Lee has to take him  
up to Atlanta Fri. to register  
or something and I think she

is writing Anne about  
meeting her there to come  
back in the car - She  
will instruct Anne.

We look for Mary Jane back  
to her work in the morning,  
I have the money ready for  
Lena's tuition at the Valhalla  
College - will have  
more time to go to the  
post office to get it off  
tomorrow when Mary Jane  
is here - just want to  
let you know you can  
depend on it - I suppose  
it will be best to pay  
by the quarter if  
other wise let me know.

Tucker says he is going  
to study hard this year,  
hope Lena will do the  
same - has she seen

any thing about her teeth  
for her flock's and health's  
sake they should not be  
allowed to go to ruin.

There is not much news  
I could write had I  
the time - Ida Lee  
wants to get the letter  
off right away so Anne  
can have time to hear  
about meeting her in  
Atlanta. I know she  
has had a wonderful  
time.
